THIS PLAINT has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff with her address c/o Samson Law Associates, The White House. 20 Genesis Close, PO Box 2425, Grand Cayman, KY1-1105 in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after service of this Complaint on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you intend to defend the action, in whole or in part, you must set out full particulars of your defence in the space provided in the Acknowledgement of Service form.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement of Service form containing full particulars of your defence within the time stated, the Plaintiff may apply for a default judgment without any further notice to you.

PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff was the winner of the annual Miss Universe Cayman Islands Pageant and holder of the title "Miss Universe Cayman" throughout the period of 9 August 2025 – 11 July 2026.
2. The Defendant, formerly known as Miss Cayman Islands Committee and/or, Miss Universe Cayman Islands Committee, at all material times, was considered the 'Franchisor' that engaged the services of the Plaintiff for her to perform the role of the National Queen and Ambassador of the Cayman Islands.
3. By agreement dated 5 September 2025, the parties entered into a written agreement (herein after called "the contract") whereby, among other things, the following were agreed:
 - a. The Defendant shall pay on behalf of the Plaintiff the costs incurred in her travels, public appearances be they local or overseas, including wardrobe and other miscellaneous expenses.
 - b. The Defendant would provide the Plaintiff with an amount of not less than \$8,000.00 Cayman Islands dollars (or its monetary equivalent) for the purchase or acquisition of modern clothes, accessories and footwear of *[sic]* as may be suitable for the performance of her Services.
 - c. The Plaintiff will be provided with a professionally designed national costume of quality suitable for international exploitation, the final approval of the design of which will be within the discretion of the Defendant (not to be unreasonably withheld).
 - d. The Defendant shall pay all costs reasonably incurred by the Plaintiff in relation to all overseas trips.
4. The Plaintiff competed in the 2025 Miss Universe competition, which was staged in Thailand. In preparation for this competition, the Plaintiff had to source clothing, a costume etc. and paid for these ahead of the competition. She was also required to travel with the requisite items which exceeded the normal baggage weight limitations for travel. Additional costs were incurred as a result of this for checking in extra bags. The above mentioned were considered as a part of her "expenses" in accordance with the contract.
5. In breach of the terms of the contract, the Defendant only provided the Plaintiff with the payment of CI\$3600 towards her expenses. All further expenses directly

incurred by the Plaintiff were paid by her family. The remainder of the funds due under the contract has, to date, not been paid by the Defendant.

6. By letter dated 4 August 2026, the Plaintiff demanded the outstanding sums owed under the contract. The Defendant has failed to pay the amounts owed, in whole or in part.
7. The Plaintiff therefore claims the principal sum of CI\$9633.33 broken down as follows:
 - a. CI\$ 4400.00 – Outstanding wardrobe minimum
 - b. CI\$ 3333.33 – Cost of National Costume
 - c. CI\$ 1900.00 – Excess baggage & costume boxes fees
8. The Plaintiff also claims pre- and post-judgment simple interest in accordance with s.34 of the Judicature Act (2021 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules 2021 at the rate of 2.375% for such period as the Court deems fit.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- a. The principal sum of CI\$9633.33;
- b. Pre and post-judgment simple interest in accordance with s.34 of the Judicature Act (2021 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules 2021 at the rate of 2.375% for such period as the Court deems fit.
- c. Costs; and
- d. Such further or other relief that his Honourable Court deems just.
