PLAINT has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after service of this **Plaint** on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman KY1-1106, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service form stating therein whether you intend to contest this action. If you intend to defend the action, in whole or in part, you must set out full particulars of your defence in the space provided in the Acknowledgement of Service form.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or fail to return the Acknowledgement of Service form containing full particulars of your defence, the Plaintiff may apply for a Default Judgment without any further notice to you.

PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

1. I am an Auto Sales and Repairs Business owner. The Plaintiff of 173 Fern Circle is the registered owner for Jacko's Auto. I therefore buy and sell vehicles from Japan and locally. Two of these vehicles were sold to the defendant Ms. Michelle Fletcher.
2. THE DEFENDANT Ms. Michelle Fletcher operates a bar called Archie's which is located on Shedden road.
3. True copies of the documents to which the Plaintiff shall refer in this Plaintiff are marked 'Exhibit-AK1'. Save where the contrary is stated, or the context otherwise requires, reference in this Plaintiff to pages, are pages in 'Exhibit-AK1'.
4. The Defendant's Trade and Business Licence is exhibited hereto as page 01 of 'Exhibit-AK1'
5. The defendant Ms. Michelle Fletcher is a customer of Jacko's Auto, who bought two vehicles on August 10th 2022.
6. I met Ms. Fletcher in February of 2022 when I sold her a vehicle. In august of 2022, Ms. Fletcher contacted me wanting to purchase two other vehicles. The vehicles were a silver Toyota Noah and a grey Suzuki SX4. Both vehicles were valued at CI \$12,000.00 each. On the 10th of August, I handed over both vehicles to her with trust and confidence in her, knowing that she had already purchased a vehicle from me in the past and paid cash for the vehicle.
7. Terms of Agreement: The Agreement between Ms. Fletcher the defendant, and myself the plaintiff, was that the defendant will pay half of the CI\$24,000.00, that is she would

pay CI\$12,000.00 on the 15th of August 2022, and she would pay the balance on the 20th of August 2022. This requirement was stated on a receipt dated 10th August 2022 as a written agreement. The next payment of CI\$12,000.00 would be paid on the 27th August 2022.

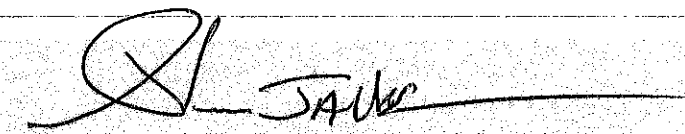
8. From the cars were sold to the defendant on the 10th of August 2022, until the 5th November 2022, I did not receive payment from the defendant. This is despite numerous visits to her business place and telephone discussions. She would say tomorrow, next week, she is putting on fundraising events like fish fry, or somebody owes her money, and she would pay me when she gets the money. Also, she would be putting on a local boat cruise and would pay me for the funds she gets. On 6th November 2024, I got CI\$500.00, on 24 March 2025, I got CI\$500.00, and on the 19th Feb 2026, I got CI\$500.00, which was the last payment I received from the defendant. The Defendant has not paid any money since 19th Feb 2026 even though a written agreement was made twice, which she has failed to comply. In total the Defendant owes CI\$22,500.00 for the two vehicles. Attached are copies of the receipts and the written agreements.

9. At some point, the defendant. Ms. Fletcher departs the Cayman Islands. I was not aware that Ms. Fletcher had left the island. I kept going to the business place and the daughter of the defendant would say that the defendant was not there. I only knew that the defendant had left the island when she got back, and she told me that she had left the island. Ms. Fletcher was contacted by the officer on 10th Feb 2026. At that time the defendant told the officer that she and the plaintiff, Mr. Clive Jackson, spoke on Sunday the 15th Feb 2026 and came to an agreement that the defendant will pay CI\$500.00 every Monday, starting of 15th February. I then went and made a written agreement on 16th February 2026, between Ms. Fletcher and I. Since then, I have only received one payment of CI\$500.00 on the 19th February 2026.

10. CONCLUDE YOUR STORY. I have made two written agreements between the defendant Ms. Fletcher and myself the plaintiff, which Ms. Fletcher did not comply with what she signed for in the agreement. Therefore, she has broken the agreement. I have waited too many years for this payment, and I therefore kindly ask the court to expedite this matter.
11. I AM NOT CLAIMING FOR PRE-JUDGMENT AND POST JUDGMENT INTEREST. I AM ONLY CLAIMING FOR WHAT WAS AGRED ON.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. Principal of \$ 22500.00 ;
 2. Simple interest of \$ on the principal claimed at the prescribed rate of 2%%. pursuant to the *Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules (2021 Revision)* calculated from when the cause of action arose/when the principal was demanded to the day the Plaint was filed ;
 3. Per diem of \$ from the date the Plaint was filed to the date judgment is entered ;
 4. Post-judgment interest from the date judgment is given until the date the judgment debt is paid in full ;
 5. Filing Fee \$ 25.00 ;
 6. Fixed Cost \$ 150.00 ;
 7. Bailiff Fees \$;

8. Costs to be assessed
 9. Such other relief as this Honorable Court sees fit.
